



Introduction



- Across Europe an estimated one in four women will experience domestic violence in their lifetime. Despite efforts to address this problem, it remains a significant challenge for policymakers, practitioners, and researchers.
- Surpassing the number of adult women in shelters in Germany is the number of children.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has further intensified stress factors for affected children, increasing the risk of maltreatment and violence.
- Consequently, there is a crucial need for adequate support to prevent long-term consequences



Domestic Violence in Germany

- 2022: 157.550 (2021: 144.044; +9,4%) registered cases of domestic violence
- victims were 80,1 % (126.349) female and 19,9 % male (31.469)
- most of the women who are victims of DV live in those relationships together with their children
- most of the children are in some way involved, either witnessing the violence or being abused themselves

Impacts on children and youth



Short term

- anxiety, depression, and other mental health issues
- difficulty sleeping, eating, and concentrating

Long term


- higher risk of developing behavioral problems, substance abuse issues, engaging in violent behavior
- profound impact on a child's development: emotional regulation, social skills, academic achievement, also distorted view of relationships and struggle to form healthy attachments later in life

Foster collaboration among networks



Dissemination of the research findings to relevant stakeholders and public

Methodology

Comprehensive data collection	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Literature search• Survey of the women and children in the shelters• Survey of their psychological stress
Facilitation of a workshop for stakeholders in the intervention system	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Establishment of collaborative networks• sharing of experiences• collaboratively identify key areas for the group program
Collaborative design of group intervention sessions	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow-up Workshop for the development of a prototype for a group session• On the basis of the literature review, data of the survey and input from the workshops development of a participative psychoeducational group intervention• Test and Refine
Dissemination	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Development and execution of digital information sessions for national, regional, and local authorities• Utilize social media platforms, press releases, and targeted awareness campaigns to disseminate information and promote public understanding of the impact of DV

Comprehensive report on knowledge and best practices on children as witnesses of DV




Improved data on documentation and psychological stress of children as witnesses of DV



Development of a specialized participative psychoeducational group offer



Increased Awareness of public authorities as well as the general public
